MATH

- → The students will be able to say the number sequence 1 to 10 by 1s,
- → The students will use direct comparison to compare two objects based on a single attribute, such as length (height), mass (weight) and volume (capacity).
- → Students will describe the characteristics of 3-D objects and 2-D shapes
- → The students will demonstrate an understanding of repeating patterns (two or three elements) by: identifying, reproducing, extending



LANGUAGE ARTS

- → The students will be active through phonics learning several of the letters
- → .The students will print their own name and copy simple sentences.
- → Students will develop their oral and social skills by using the following vocabulary: (stop please, thank you, please, your welcome, may I, asks questions)
- → The students will develop their Listening Skills through: (sounds, drawing phonics, following directions in 2-3 steps and story predictions)
- → The students will connect stories to self; text (other stories) and to the world.

ARABIC

- → The students will be involved in learning stories about the letters
 - د س م
- → The students will be learning new vocabulary related to the letters.
- → The students will be reading and writing the letters with its short and long vowel.
- → The students will be writing the letters with its different shapes at the beginning, middle and the end of a word.



SOCIAL STUDIES

- → The students will value his or her own unique characteristics, interests, gifts and talents and how their characteristics make them unique.
- → The students will appreciates feelings, ideas, stories and experiences shared by others
- → The students will understand how culture and language contribute to my unique identity
- → The students will show respect and acceptance of people as they are
- → The students will assume responsibility for personal actions, words and choices.

- → The students will become aware of the five senses and how they are used to explore, investigate and describe the world.

Tips for Reading Success at Home

- 1. Make books a part of family life Always have books around at home. That way you and your children are ready to get reading, even if it's only for ten minutes.
- 2. Join your local library Get your child a library card. They'll be able to get their hands on hundreds of fantastic books. Let them choose what they want to read to help them develop their own interests.
- 3. Read about something they're interested in Help your child find the right book for them. It doesn't matter if it's fiction, poetry, comic books or non-fiction.
- 4. All reading is good Don't rule out non-fiction, comics, graphic novels, magazines or leaflets. Reading is reading and it's all worthwhile.
- 5. Get comfortable! Snuggle up together somewhere warm and cozy, whether it's in bed, on a beanbag or on the sofa. And make sure your child has somewhere comfy to read on their own too.
- 6. Ask questions To keep them interested in the story, ask your child questions as you read. Start with 'Where did we get to last time?', 'Can you remember what's happened so far?' and 'What do you think will happen next?'.
- 7. Read whenever you get the chance Have a book or magazine with you for any time your child has to wait, like at the doctor's or the dentist.

- 8. Read favourites again and again Encourage your child to re-read the books and poems they love. Re-reading helps to build fluency and confidence.
- 9. Enjoy bedtime stories Read with your kids at bedtime as often as you can. It's a great way to end the day and to spend valuable time with them.
- 10. Make the most of rhyme and repetition Books and poems with rhymes and repeated words or phrases are great for getting your kids to join in and remember the words.
