Math Talk With Your Child/ren:


Strengthen your child/ren's mental math?

- Mental math is an aspect of the Alberta mathematics curriculum from Grades 1-8.
- Mental math strategies build on and extend students' understanding of number properties and relationships.
- Fluency with numbers is a building block for learning more complex math.

Sample Activity:

- Subitizing (without counting, how many are there?)

Curriculum Updates:

Language Arts:

- The children will combine experiences with knowledge of words and story to help understand what they read.
- The children will read and gain an understanding (comprehension) using transforming strategies.
- The children will identify by sight an increasing number of high frequency words and familiar words.
- The children will associate sounds with some vowel combinations, consonant blends and digraphs, and letter clusters to read unfamiliar words in context.
- The children will read with fluency, accuracy and expression.
- The children will write letters using a friendly letter format.



Math:

The children will use patterns to solve problems:

- They will demonstrate an understanding of repeating patterns (three to five elements) by: • describing • extending • comparing • creating patterns using manipulatives, diagrams
- They will demonstrate an understanding of increasing patterns by: • describing • reproducing • extending • creating numerical (numbers to 100)
- The children will collect, display and analyze data.

Curriculum Updates:


Social Studies:

The children will investigate the physical geography of Saskatoon exploring and reflecting the following questions for inquiry:

- How are the geographic regions different from where we live?
- What are the major geographical regions, landforms and bodies of water in each community?
- What are the main differences in climate among these communities?
- What geographic factors determined the establishment of each community (e.g., soil, water and climate)?
- How does the physical geography of each community shape its identity?

Science:

- The children will investigate the growth and development of plants and animals and consider their relationship to humans.
- The children will analyze and describe how plants and animals interact with each other and within environments.



Halaqas:

There are few places where a Muslim can get beneficial knowledge like a halaqa. It is a gathering for knowledge and understanding of Islam, and a place to improve upon our faith.

1. Increases our Iman:

Many people get an 'iman high' from listening to Islamic lectures. The more you hear about the beauty of the words of Allah (ta'ala), or the more you learn about the life of Prophet Muhammad (ﷺ), the more your heart softens.

Attending a halaqa frequently, does this to you. It feeds your soul with the goodness of Islam. It raises your spirit, calms your heart, and fills it with the love of the deen.

"So give good tidings to My servants. Who listen to speech and follow the best of it. Those are the ones Allah has guided, and those are people of understanding." (Quran 39:17-18)

2. Earning a Hasanat:

The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ) said, "He who follows a path in quest of knowledge, Allah will make the path of Jannah easy to him. The angels lower their wings over the seeker of knowledge, being pleased with what he does. The inhabitants of the heavens and the earth and even the fish in the depth of the oceans seek forgiveness for him."

3. Brings Our Ummah Together:

When we have these circles of knowledge, they bind us together more as a community.

Whenever you are seeking knowledge, whether at a halaqa or anywhere else, remember the Prophet (ﷺ)'s prayer:

"Allahumma inni a'udhu bika min 'ilmin la yanfa'u, wa qalbin la yakhsha'u, wa du'a'in la yasma'u, wa nafsinn la tashba'u. (O Allah, I seek refuge with You from knowledge that is of no benefit, a heart that is not humble, a supplication that is not heard and a soul that is not satisfied.)"
